the Master of Science programme in International Cooperation and Urban Development (Mundus Urbano) is the Faculty of Architecture's flagship international programme, focusing on development planning. The programme is fully accredited and has received funding through the European Commission under the Erasmus Mundus Framework since 2008. This funding has recently been extended for a further 5 years. The programme is fully taught in English and courses are taught by a range of international guest professors, lecturers (scholars) and professional experts with experience in planning and development. A particular focus is placed on planning within developing countries and case study material is drawn from a variety of on-going international cooperation projects which enables students to critically assess the impacts of planning in academia with the role of the planner as a professional.

Curriculum/approach description Four European Universities jointly host the Mundus Urbano programme. TU Darmstadt acts as the host institution and provides the first year of foundational studies to all students. Students may then follow a specialisation track in any one of the partner institutions in pursuit of a double-degree:
i) Universitat de Internacional de Catalunya, Barcelona – specialisation in Emergency Architecture
ii) Universite Pierre-Mendes France, Grenoble – specialisation in Social development and planning
iii) University of Tor Vergata Rome – specialisation in Development Economics

Alternatively, all non Erasmus Mundus students may elect to complete their two-years of study at the TU Darmstadt itself.

In some instances, registered PhD students do not work within the Faculty and simply complete their independent research under the guidance of in-house Professors who hold an interest in their topic.</p> <p>Additionally, the Faculty does contribute to cooperation in research at doctorate and post-doctorate level with other Faculties within the University as well as with external partners.</p>
