Graduates have profile in spatial planning and design offering a balanced range of courses in design and planning: Design and Spatial Forms, Rural Planning, Urban Design, Local Plans, Landscape Architecture, Transportation Planning, Spatial Planning, Urban Regeneration. The school's socio-cultural approach to planning is evident in courses such as Urban History, History of Art and Architecture, and Settlement Processes. Students also develop skills in Computer-Aided Design and Spatial Analysis Methods. Students also have to secure a 6 week work experience.</p>
